Christmas and Easter: Independent yet Interdependent

Why are Christmas and Easter independent, yet interdependent? Can we celebrate one of these events without the other? If the above question is not possible, why is this so? What events in the two thousand years following it would not have taken place or changed in character? Finally, is there anything that we can learn from these events and this study of them?

Christmas and Easter are independent, yet interdependent for a basic reason: If one did not occur, the other would not have occurred or we would not celebrate it today. If you look at the facts, you can see why this reason is true. If Jesus did not become a baby at the first Christmas, he could not have died, and three days later, rise from the dead. However, if He was born, nailed to the cross and died, and did not rise from the dead, why would we celebrate His birth if we did? The only reason I can think of is that we still might celebrate it is because people would say He was the Great Teacher of all teachers, and thus its significance would change.

You cannot celebrate either Christmas or Easter by itself for another basic reason: If one of these events did not occur nearly two thousand years ago, why would we celebrate the other in its current form? Look at the facts, and this is clear to see. If Jesus was not born, could we celebrate His death and resurrection? We could not, because it could not happen. On the other hand, if He did not rise from the dead, why would we celebrate His birth? We probably would not, unless we considered Him the Great Teacher, and followed His teachings. To others, it would not make sense.

Another reason why we cannot only celebrate Christmas or Easter is this: The lone celebration by itself would not fully tell the story of salvation. If you only celebrated His birth, would you fully understand what Jesus did the first Easter? It would be impossible, unless you were a good student of the Bible. If you only celebrated Easter, would you fully understand how Jesus became a man? Again, it would be nearly impossible, except to good Bible students.

Several things or events would not have occurred or changed in character if these events had not occurred. First, everyone would not know of His life and teachings. This is an important point for a basic reason: Either He would not have become a man, or only historians and followers of His cult would study His life and teachings.

Second, we would have to become Jews in order to go to heaven. Third, we would still be worshiping idols. Fourth, only the Old Testament would be in existence. Fifth, the papacy would not be in existence. Sixth, the Crusades in the twelfth century would only have been political and military in nature. Finally, the Vatican City would still be part of Italy.

I have learned several things from the bench in my study of them. I have learned like Christmas and Easter are independent, yet interdependent. I have also learned that several important events and things were dependent on them.

Salvation

What is salvation? What is the doctrine of grace, and how does it relate to salvation? What is the doctrine of justification by faith, and how does it relate to salvation?

Salvation is the act or process of God saving man from sin. It is a gift from God. Everyone who wants to go to heaven must accept it, for Romans 3:23 states, "For all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God".

No one can earn salvation. God saves you only by His grace. This is the doctrine of grace, and without it, God cannot save us. For Ephesians 2:8-9 says, "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith - and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God - not by works, so that no one can boast." God did not wait for us to realise our sin and call out to Him, but sent His son, Jesus, to die for our sins. For Romans 5:8 states, "But God demonstrates His own love for us by this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

The doctrine of justification by faith is this: When you believe that Jesus rose from the dead, God cancels the guilt of your sin and declares you righteous. For Romans 10:9-10 states, "That if you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved." In addition, Romans 4:5 states, "However, to the man who does not work but trusts God who justifies the wicked, his faith is credited as righteousness."

I have learned much about salvation. I have learned that when I believed in Jesus, God justified me. I have also learned that it is the gift of God to man.

Faith

What is faith? How can you show your faith? What are the results of faith? What is its power? What are the costs of faith? What are the rewards of faith? What are some of the examples of faith in action? What can we learn from this study?

Faith believes that something or someone is true. It also believes in God and that He can do the impossible. According to Hebrews 11:1, it is also "being sure of what we can hope for and certain of what we do not see".

According to the Bible, baptism is the way of showing your faith. For Matthew 3:6 says, "Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River." In addition, Luke 3:3 says, "He went into all the country around the Jordan, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins."

In the Bible, amazing things happened for those who believed in God. David had faith in God, and as a result, God gave him victory over Goliath and all his enemies. Jotham, a descendant of David, also had faith in God and obeyed Him, so God gave him victories in battle. Phileasar had faith and was zealous for God, and He counted it for righteousness in His sight. Jesus said that anyone with faith can command a mountain to cast itself in the sea and it will.

Faith's power is the ability to do greater works than Jesus did. In John chapter 14, verse 12, He said, "I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father." We wonder why we cannot do great things for God. It is clear to see: We do not have enough faith in God.

If a person has faith in God, others may laugh at or persecute them for their faith. Their family may even persecute them. Matthew 10:35-37 says, "For I have come to turn 'a man against his father, a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law - a man's enemies will be the members of his own household. Anyone who loves his father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; anyone who loves his son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me." According to Paul, the world will persecute everyone for their faith for Second Timothy 3:12 states, "In fact, everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted."

In spite of the costs, faith does have rewards. If you have faith in God and obey Him, you will prosper. Ebed-Melech's trust in God and his showing of it, by rescuing Jeremiah the prophet from the miry pit, resulted in God promising him that God would save his life after Jerusalem fell. In the book of Matthew, a woman's faith healed her from bleeding that had been happening for twelve years. God will bless us with all blessings when we have faith in Christ. If you are faithful on earth, God will reward you in heaven.

Many examples of faith in action are in the Bible. Rahab showed her faith in God by hiding the Israelite spies that Joshua had sent. In Matthew 25:35-36, Jesus said that we could exercise our faith by feeding the hungry, giving a drink to the thirsty, being friendly to the friendless, clothing the naked, or visiting those who are sick or in prison. Peter and John showed their faith in Jesus by healing the crippled beggar in Jesus' name. According to Hebrews 11:7, Noah built an ark because of his faith in God. If your faith is genuine, it will produce good deeds.

I have learned many things from this study of faith. I have learned what faith is. I have also learned what can happen if I have faith.
